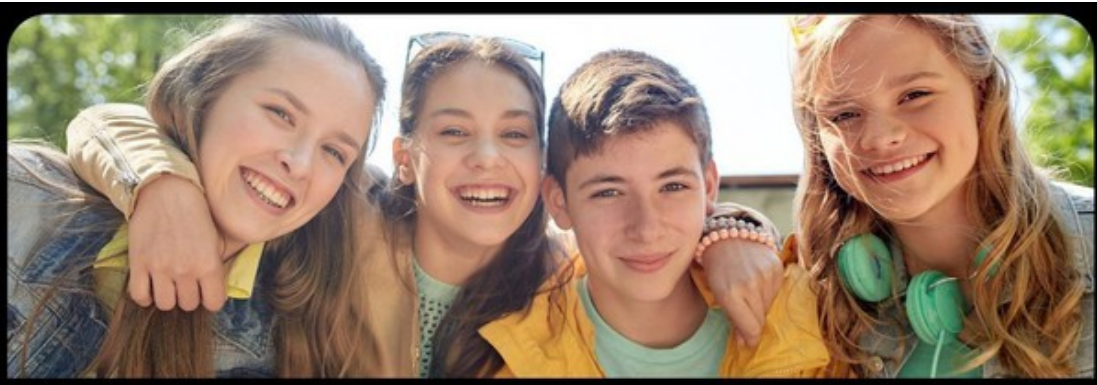

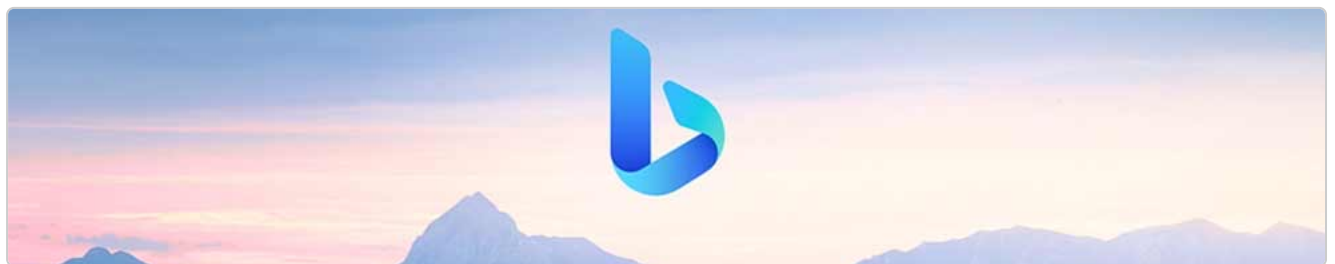

What is SARB?

SARB - School Attendance Review Board

SARB Overview: SARB refers to Truancy and Unexcused Absences.

15 Tardies in one quarter is equivalent to a Truancy. A Truancy is when student is confirmed to have deliberately cut a scheduled class or ≥ 5 minutes late to class)

Difference between an absence in high school and elementary school: High school counts periods towards truancy and unexcused absences, elementary school count days towards truancy and unexcused absences.

Stein's SARB Guidelines and Consequences

Number of Unexcused Absences

Consequence

3 days / 15 periods of unexcused absences

SARB 1 Letter sent home and Advisor calls Parent/Guardian

6 days / 30 periods of unexcused absences

SARB 2 Letter sent home. Parent/Guardian meets with Administrator

9 days / 45 periods unexcused absences

SARB 3 Letter sent home. Parent/Guardian meets with Counselor and District Truancy Officer

12 days / 60 periods unexcused absences

Student referred to District SARB

Sick Days. Students are allowed 10 parent/guardian excused sick days per school year. Once your student reaches 10 sick days the Attendance Clerk will notify you that your student now needs a Doctor's Note to excuse their sick days. A student who needs a Doctor's Note at another school will need a Doctor's Note at Stein.

SARB reports are run by the Attendance Clerk weekly. ***Students may come to Stein already in the SARB process. The process is continual for the school year.***
